TASTE Passport FAQs

I will be visiting wineries with a group of friends. Do they each need a TASTE passport?

- Each person who is interested in participating in the TASTE passport and tasting experiences will each require their own passport. Each passport offers one person a minimum of 6 tasting experiences per program.

How do I know how much time to book in between tastings?

 With any wine tour, it is recommended to plan ahead and determine the distance in between each stop. Each TASTE passport experience is expected to take approximately 45 minutes. We recommend you select the 6 tasting experience you would like to enjoy, and then use Google Maps to help determine how much time and distance is in between each stop. We recommend starting your first winery at the earliest time slot (11:00 am).

How much time should I allow for each tasting experience?

- We recommend at least 45 minutes at each location to allow for time to enjoy the experience and purchase wine from the tasting room.

Do I need to book each tasting experience in advance?

- Yes, each tasting must be booked in advance. Please use the booking platform on our website to learn more about each participating stop and the offer. Simply select up to 6 stops to visit and a time slot for each. Keep in mind wineries have limited availability each hour so book as soon as possible to avoid disappointment.

Do I have to visit all 6 stops in one day?

No. During the TASTE passport weekend for that particular location, guests can split up the
experiences on either Saturday or Sunday.

One of our friends will be the Designated Driver for our vehicle. Are they able to experience the event as well?

- Yes. We offer a Designated Drive Pass that will offer guests the food portion of the event only. You can purchase this at the same time that you purchase your regular Passports, simply select that option for that guest and the regular option for the other passes.

What are the dates of the TASTE passport?

 We are offering the TASTE passport as part of the Okanagan Spring Wine Festival over several weekends. June 3 and 4: Kelowna and West Kelowna, June 10 and 11: Summerland, Naramata Bench and Penticton, June 10 and 11: Oliver and Osoyoos and June 11: The District Wine Village.
